How did SIP construction help you get this job?

Completely Beyond net-zero project, this is a Positive Energy home that generates enough power to operate all needs, and two electric car stations. Few other technologies (than SIPs) are able to achieve this without extensive materials, costs and installation requirements.

SIP wall thickness and core material: 6" GPS core (Platinum) wall panels **SIP roof thickness and core material:** 10" GPS core (Platinum) roof panels

Describe the benefits of using SIPs on this project. Did SIPs help save time, labor, construction costs, or energy?

All of the above. Install time (FAST), labor costs (minimal compared to other advanced framing options) and ENERGY efficiency. The goal for this project was to generate renewable energy, which is multiplied when the envelope is extremely efficient and much of the energy generated can go to other things (two electric cars).

Describe any innovative design elements or structural engineering involved:

Positive Energy Home! The system together is innovative in design as it powers all home energy, and two electric cars! Through a combination of the following systems: solar panels, hydronic radiant floors, triple-pane windows, radiant hydronic floor heating, advanced HVAC & HRV, and Structural Insulated Panels (SIPs) this home is able to achieve positive energy to power two electric cars. Additional design considerations include shell (building envelope) designed factoring in orientation with smaller east & west windows to avoid overheating via solar gain.

Chilltrix CX34 heatpump to radiant hydronic (1st floor) and fan coils on 2nd & 3rd floors
Zehnder Comfoair 250 whole house HRV. Zehnder comfoair 250 whole house heat recovery ventilator (HRV).

Advanced features include: solar panels, triple-pane windows, ultra-efficient heat pump, 50 year lifespan Allura siding.

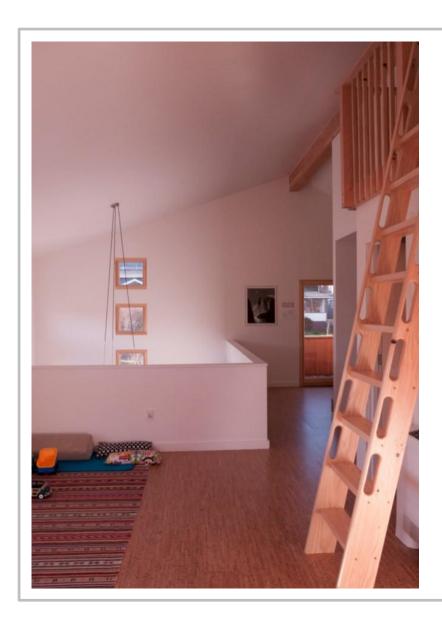

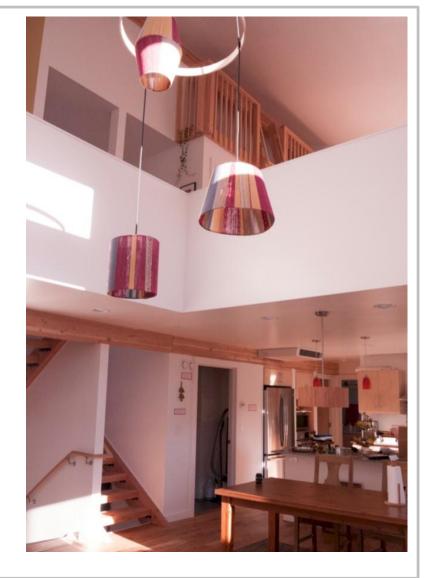

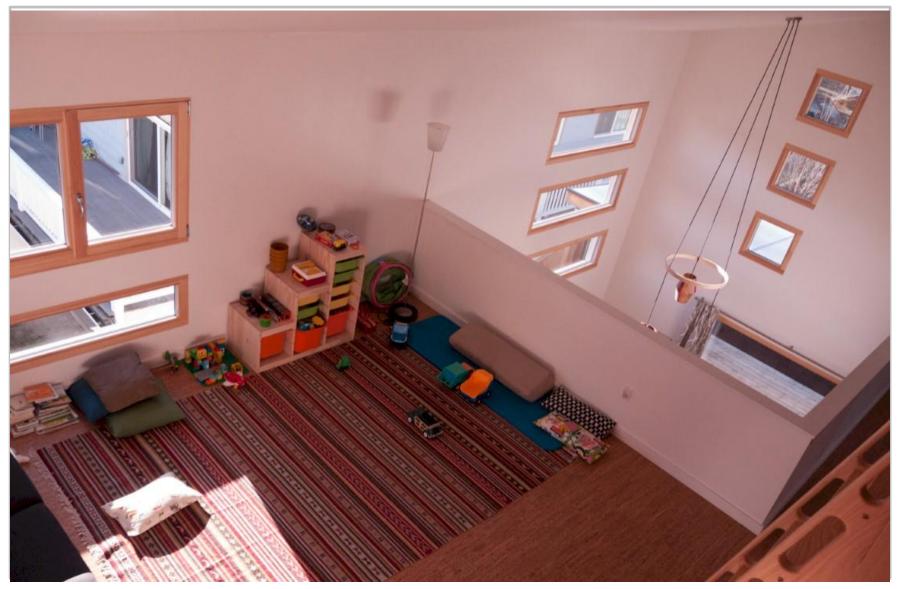
Main floor living

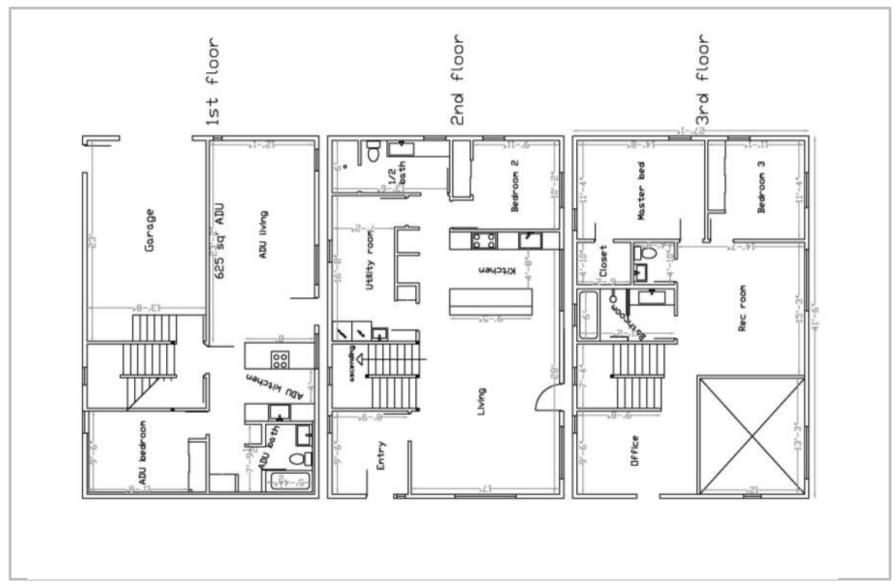
Solar panel install
