Describe the end use of the building: This is a family vacation beach house. Due to the increase in insurance costs on the coast, the owners wanted a very strong hurricane resistant home. We were able to achieve 75% savings on flood insurance and 22% on Wind and Hail insurance through the use of SIPs. This home achieved IBHS Fortified for Hurricane Gold certification

How did SIP construction help you get this job? The owner is very sawy in terms of advanced building construction methods (he owns a glass manufacturing company, his brother is an Architect, his son is an architect and another son is a project manager for a large nationwide home builder.) He wanted SIPs and I gave him a tour of my personal house which is built with SIPs and we toured a few houses under construction and he was sold. Since we are the only Builders in our area that has extensive experience with SIPs he decided to go forward with us.

Describe the benefits of using SIPs on this project. Did SIPs help save time, labor, construction costs, or energy? SIPs helped us save time and labor on installation. The real savings is the energy efficiency of the home. This project achieved Energy Star 5+.

Describe any innovative design elements or structural engineering involved: The roof is gull wing curved roof that has a 40' radius. The upstairs is an open great room and kitchen the curved roof is exposed and faced with Cypress T&G through out the upstairs including the Master bedroom and bath. The ceiling height is 16.5' and the only collar tie support comes from 1" steel rods spanning across the width of the house at 11' high 8' o.c. It is on pilings 12' above ground elevation in the 130 MPH wind zone across the street from the Atlantic Ocean. We raised the house 3' above code to the lowest horizontal member due to being in the Coastal High Hazard Area. In order to meet the requirements of the IBHS Fortified Certification all interior walls were sheeted with plywood which made them all sheer walls. We used Impact windows throughout as well.
