Before deciding on SIPs, the homeowners had contemplated going with a double studded wall to achieve a higher R value. So when we factored in the amount of time, cost of labor and material, the SIPs were more cost effective and a better end product.

Describe any innovative design elements or structural engineering involved: The design of the home is quite unique. It was designed to have maximum energy efficiency and an efficient use of space. The emphasis was on nature and natural materials, so the home incorporates almost no plastics or synthetics.









