Describe the end use of the building: Single Family Residential Unattached - Spec home

How did SIP construction help you get this job? This is my first spec home, everything I have done previously has been custom. Given the difficult and trickey nature of reaching the 2015 IECC code in an ethical manner while building with sticks, going with SIPs was a no brainer. If it cost me a hair more to do it with SIPs, that is nothing compared to building a vastly superior house correctly the first time. But I really think it cost me about the same as stick built. The decreased liabilities and call backs are an added benefit as well.

SIP wall thickness and core material: 6 1 /2" EPS SIP roof thickness and core material: 8 1/4" EPS

Describe the benefits of using SIPs on this project. Did SIPs help save time, labor, construction costs, or energy? It saved a little bit of time. It helped with labor shortages as the framers had not used this material before but it was so easy to assemble it was difficult to put together incorrectly with fewer people. This quickly gave them confidence in the project as a whole. The framers were amazed at how strong and tight the envelope was. As I told them (some of them had 30+ years experience), this is the best house ya'll have ever built and I have the science to back that up.

Describe any innovative design elements or structural engineering involved: I definitely took advantage of the SIP roof to vault the ceilings. I was able to utilize a 6' long linear electric fireplace as a show piece in the family room. It came out great. People have been impressed with how straight and clean the lines are on this project. SIP really lends itself to contemporary designs so it really helped us beautifully achieve those goals.

Describe any other energy-saving materials used in the building envelope other than SIPs. List U-values of windows used and the U or R-value of any insulation materials. (judged only for High Performance Category) Windows are a Milguard Vinyl casements. U-value is .27 and the SHGC is .23.

Please list any energy-efficient products or design features, such as lighting, hot water heating, appliances, passive solar (judged only for High Performance Category): Electric Heat pump water heater (10 HPSF) with a convective loop delivery system. Like a recirculating system but uses convection to move the heated water naturally while the system is closed. No need for a recirculating pump that draws energy and eventually has to be replaced. The appliances are energy star rated. There is a ERV for fresh air replacement. 65 CFM at 45 watts.

The bath fans have humidistats that turn on automatically when the humidity gets above 60% in the bathrooms and laundry room. They automatically shut off when the humidity gets back down to a safe level.

The electric fireplace is capable of showing flames without generating heat, if desired. Handy for Texas when it is warm out but still want the ambiance of a fire in the fireplace.

Any additional comments on the project: Pecan House on Trammel is an elegant living and entertaining house that gets your more bang for your buck. It is named after the stately pecan tree in the backyard. I brought that concept indoors with a pecan wood mantel over the fireplace, a pecan wood barn door in the master suite for the closet, and engineered pecan wood floors downstairs. The excellent flow of the layout while bright and light gives this a warm and happy feel. It fells like a warm hug...like home. People feel and comment on this upon entering the home.

This house is well built for an active family with it large back yard (room for a pool with plenty of room to spare) that connects to Dallas' extensive hike and bike trail system. A stroll to the local park and only a 3/4 mile from the mass transit train station.

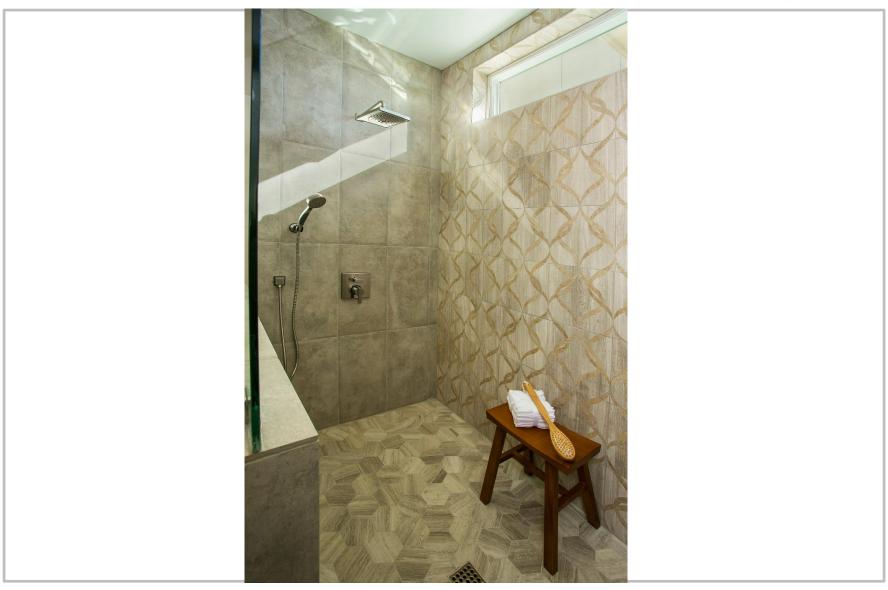

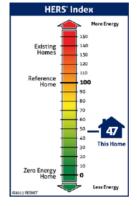
